#### Writing Exercise 英文訳例

- 1) Opposition parties delayed the enactment by resorting to filibusters and submitting no-confidence resolutions and censure motions against Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and others.
- 2) The legislation will allow Japan the restrictive use of its right to collective self-defense. Opponents demanded it be scrapped, citing public opposition, legal experts' views that it is unconstitutional, and what they saw as inconsistencies in government explanations of the legislation.
- 3) Hackers send e-mails containing computer viruses to private companies and government offices in an attempt to steal information. The viruses are often hidden in attachments such as Microsoft Word documents and infect computers as soon as the files are opened.
- 4) New tactics were used this year. Some of the e-mails were disguised as notices from the National Tax Agency about online tax filing. In other cases, hackers pretended to be co-workers or business partners.
- 5) Experts are advising people to use the latest anti-virus software and encrypt important information. They also say that separating internal computer networks from the Internet is an effective way to block such attacks.
